Know Your Rights

Your Student's School Must ...

- call home in *your* preferred language
- **send** home communications in *your* preferred language
- **have** a proper ESOL program to help your student become proficient in English
- **allow** your student access to all classes, clubs, and programs that English-proficient students have access to
- provide supports in content classes to ensure that the content is accessible to your student
- provide IEP / Special Education materials and communications in your preferred language

Your Student's School Must Not ...

- ask about your or your student's immigration status
- ask for your or your student's Social Security Number (SSN)
- have a sibling or other student interpret for the school
- **prevent** your student from participating in a school activity because of their English proficiency
- **pretend** that your student will just naturally learn English without support. (Your student *can* learn that way, but the school is required to do more than that!)
